**TIP 10: REHEARSE, REHEARSE AND REHEARSE ORALLY. CONTINUOUS PRACTICE IS ESSENTIAL FOR COMMUNICATIVE SUCCESS.**

**DON'T FORGET TO DO THE FOLLOWING BEFORE YOU BEGIN YOUR INTERVENTION!**

- Take a deep breath a few times before you start talking
- Move your body to activate yourself (this could be done by dancing!)
- Warm your voice up to get it ready. You can do this with the "rrrrrr" and by playing with different intonations
- Visualise the place of the presentation and what the first minutes will be like: how you will go on stage, you will have a microphone, it will be a virtual presentation, ..)
- Arrive early to check that the visual and audio equipment are working properly before starting the presentation
- Have water by your side to drink when you need it
- Have annotated words, names, concepts that you find difficult to have on hand when you may need them, with a very short script
- Remember that you are explaining the topic to your group and that you must show enthusiasm and motivation for the content that you explain
- If you have set out to improve something, focus on it. Little by little and well-written, you don't want to change everything at once
- Just in case: "I trust myself, I worked on the presentation, I want to explain it to the group and, even if something happens, I can continue, because everyone makes mistakes and from the I will learn from my mistake"
